- Atresia ani

0 - 5 HOURS:

- Congenital swayback

- Hypothermia (exposure)

5-36 HOURS:

- Castration (incorrect)
- Enteritis
- Hypothermia (starvation)
- Inhalation pneumonia
- Stiff lamb disease
- Watery mouth

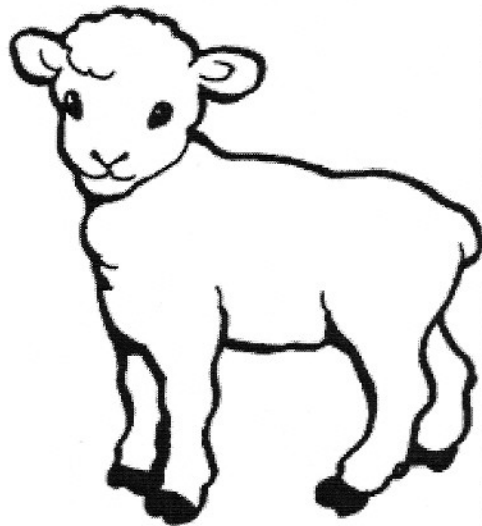
36 HOURS:

- Eye infections
- Joint ill
- Lamb dysentery
- Liver necrosis (liver necrobacillosis)
- Navel ill
- Scad
- Spinal abscess
- Tetanus

Problems in Newborn Lambs According to Age at Which They May First Be Seen

(The number of conditions to be considered increases as the lambs get older, i.e. for a four hour-old lamb only conditions in the first two categories need be considered, but for a two day-old lamb all the conditions are possible.)
